 - The Summit will be in person and also offered virtually. The registration is \$60 for in person and \$45 for those joining remotely
 - Speakers:
 - Brian Ardiger of Inside/Outside Podcast
 - Tony Goins from the Nebraska Department of Economic Development will give an update
 - Dr. Josie Schafer from Center for Public Affairs Research will share about lay of the land of small business in Nebraska
 - Have 10 breakout sessions that are either two 30 minute or one 60 minute session
 - A lot of the sessions are centered around how do the businesses pivot and what resources are available for small businesses
 - Big Idea Talks panel will include three different businesses from varied industries. The owners will talk about the changes they made to survey during COVID-19. What practices have stuck and what can they do to plan for the future. It will be a fun, interactive session.
 - We are supporting teachers who want to broadcast into the sessions live or they will be recorded so they can tune in on their own time since teachers are not able to travel this year.
 - Do need moderators, especially since we will be broadcasting. It will take a lot more people to make sure all the technology works.
